# DOUGLAS CITY COUNCIL

Douglas City Council is responsible for various functions including refuse and recycling collection, social housing, street lighting, public toilets, parks and open spaces, playgrounds and other leisure facilities, public events within the City, car parking, building control, HBN Library, the crematorium/cemetery, administration of the Isle of Man Local Government Superannuation Scheme and the enforcement of local byelaws. All these functions and services are paid for by the City rate which is fixed by the Council.

## THE ELECTION PROCESS

Local Authority General Elections will take place on Thursday, 24th April, 2025. Douglas City Council will have 12 vacant seats, split between the four Wards, Central, East, North and South.

To stand as a local authority member you must appear on the Register of Electors as of 1st January 2025 – you do not have to be registered in the constituency for which you are standing. To check you are registered visit gov.im/registertovote or call the Crown and Elections Unit on 685754.

The term of office is 4 years.

Nomination forms and information packs will be available from March 2025 for collection from Douglas City Hall.

# DOUGLAS COUNCIL MEETINGS

Elected Members are required to attend regular Committee, Council and other meetings. All Council and Committee Meetings will take place during office hours and last no longer than half a day (morning or afternoon). An attendance allowance can be claimed as follows;

- Daytime rate £12.50 per hour (to a maximum of £50 per session)
- Evening rate £7.50 per hour (to a maximum of £30 per session)
- The maximum allowance payable to a member per annum is £6,000
- Travel allowance can also be claimed if appropriate.
